


# America East



## Academic Achievement

America East consistently ranks among the top achieving conference by any NCAA metric. In 2011-12, America East had the third-highest Academic Progress Rate. The conference continued on an upward trend with its APR, maintaining or exceeding the previous score each year since 2004-05.

## Institutional Strength

Four America East schools rank among the top 100 national universities in the most recent U.S. News and World Report Best College Rankings. Among FBS and Division I Conferences, only the Ivy League had more representatives in the top 100.

## *Athletic Success*

America East teams combined for 9 NCAA Championship wins in 2011-12, the most in conference history. Thirteen athletes earned All-America honors in individual sports, including Lucy Van Dalen (left) who became the third National Champion in conference history when she won the mile at the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships.

# 2012-13 Preseason Coaches' Poll

Coming off a season in which it won its fifth America East men's basketball since 2003, University of Vermont is the coaches' preseason choice to top the standings again in 2012-13. The selections were announced on Tuesday, Oct. 23 as part of America East's Basketball Media Day held at University at Albany's SEFCU Arena, the site of the 2013 America East Men's and Women's Basketball Championship.

The Catamounts received five of eight possible first-place votes (coaches were not allowed to vote for their team) and 60 points, followed by last year's runner-up and regular-season champion Stony Brook University, which received the other four first-place votes and 58 points. Boston University came in third with 49 points, followed by Albany in fourth with 38 points and University of Maine in fifth with 35 points. University of New Hampshire (34 points) was next followed by University of Hartford (26), UMBC (15) and Binghamton University (9).

Vermont (24-12 overall, 13-3 AE in 2011-12) will have six players, including three starters, back from its 2012 America East championship-winning squad. The Catamounts, who recorded their ninth 20-win season in their last 11 in 2011-12, beat Stony Brook on the road to claim the conference crown and went on to defeat Lamar in the first round of the NCAA tournament for their second-ever NCAA win. UVM ranked among the top defensive teams in the league last year, finishing second and 31st nationally in scoring defense (60.9 ppg) and first in field goal percentage defense (.406). Junior Brian Voelkel, the Most Outstanding Player of the America East Championship, led that charge, earning All-Defensive and third-team All-America East honors last year after pacing the league in rebounding (8.6 rpg), ranking second in assists (5.1 apg) and finishing third in steals (1.7 spg). Second-year head coach John Becker and his team open their title defense at Siena on Nov. 9.

Stony Brook (22-10, 14-2) is coming off its best season in its Division I history and brings back eight letterwinners from a team that won the America East regular-season crown, reached the league title game for the second-straight year and made its second NIT appearance in three years last season. The Seawolves had success because of their lock down defense last year, ranking among the best defensive teams in the country as they were fourth in rebound margin (plus-8.3) and 13th in points allowed (59.1 papg). Senior forward Tommy Brenton (7.9 ppg, 8.1 rpg, 3.4 apg), the league's reigning Defensive Player of the Year, is the conference's lone returning first-team all-conference performer and will again lead the defensive effort. Junior Dave Coley, Stony Brook's top returning scorer, will be looked at to carry the offensive load after averaging 10.0 points per game as a sophomore. Reigning Coach of the Year Steve Pikiell leads SBU against Marist in its opener on Nov. 9.

Boston U. (16-16, 12-4) welcomes back six letterwinners and three starters from a team that won 12 America East games and finished third in the regular-season standings, the 10th time in the last 11 it has finished third or higher. Junior D.J. Irving (11.4 ppg, 5.4 apg) is the team's top returnee after earning second-team All-America East honors last season. Boston U., which allowed under 64 points per game (63.6 ppg) for the second straight season last year, will need to replace reigning America East Player of the Year Darryl Partin, who accounted for 31 percent of the team's scoring output last year. Joe Jones, who will begin his second season as the Terriers' head coach, welcomes five newcomers to this year's team, including guard Maurice Watson, a Parade All-American last season as well as an ESPN Top-100 recruit.

Albany (19-15, 9-7) returns eight letterwinners and three starters from a team that won 19 games last year, its most since the 2006-07 season. Senior Mike Black (13.4 ppg, 4.3 apg in 2011-12), the conference's active leading scorer (1,024 points) and assist man (299 assists), will be the catalyst for the Great Danes after earning second-team all-conference honors last year. Albany will need to replace the scoring output of all-league performers Gerardo Suero (21.5 ppg) and Logan Aronhalt (13.8 ppg), who accounted for 45 percent of its points in 2011-12. Senior Jay-

son Guerrier will assume a more active role in the team's plans this year after posting a league-best .423 three-point shooting percentage last year. Will Brown, the longest tenured head coach in America East, begins his 12th season at Albany against Duquesne on Nov. 9.

Maine (12-17, 6-10) welcomes back six letterwinners and three starters from its 2011-12 squad and is the league's only team to bring back an all-conference, all-rookie and all-defensive selection. The Black Bears, which ranked second in America East averaging 68.6 points per game last year, will lean on junior Alasdair Fraser, a preseason all-conference selection, who ranked 12th in scoring (12.9 ppg) and fourth in rebounding (7.8 rpg) last year en route to earning third-team All-America East honors. Sophomore Justin Edwards, an All-Rookie selection, and senior Mike Allison, will also be keys for Ted Woodward's team, which begins play at Dartmouth on Nov. 9.

New Hampshire (13-16, 7-9) will have nine letterwinners and three starters back from its 2011-12 squad, which tied for fifth in the conference standings, the program's best finish since 2009. The Wildcats ranked in the 80th percentile nationally in scoring defense last season, holding foes to just 62.8 points per game. Senior Chandler Rhoads, the team's top returning scorer (11.2 ppg in 2011-12), earned America East All-Defensive honors for the second straight year for Bill Herrion's squad, which opens up its season Nov. 10 against Suffolk.

Hartford (9-22, 7-9) has seven letterwinners, including three starters, back from a team that was the youngest in the league last year as freshmen accounted for 60.4 percent of the team's scoring output. Mark Nwakamma (9.6 ppg, 3.9 rpg, .552 FG%) and Nate Sikma (8.7 ppg, 4.3 rpg) return as sophomores after becoming the first Hartford tandem to each earn America East All-Rookie honors in the same year last season. John Gallagher, who begins his third season as Hartford's head coach, leads his squad against Quinnipiac in its 2012-13 opener Nov. 9.

UMBC (5-26, 3-13) brings back more letterwinners (11) and scoring output (82.8 percent) from last year than any other America East squad. Junior Chase Plummer, one of four returning UMBC starters, is the league's top returning scorer (15.4 ppg in 2011-12) and fourth-leading rebounder (7.9 rpg). A second-team All-America East standout last year, Plummer was the lone player to rank in the league's top five in both scoring (4th) and rebounding (5th) in 2011-12. Aki Thomas takes over as acting head coach and will make his debut when UMBC meets Penn in its opener Nov. 9.

Binghamton (2-29, 1-15) begins its first season under Tommy Dempsey and returns nine letterwinners and three starters from last year's team. Dempsey comes to Binghamton after spending seven years as the head coach at Rider, where he went 119-105, made three postseason appearances and earned 2008 MAAC Coach of the Year honors. Senior Jimmy Gray will direct the Bearcats after averaging 8.3 points, 3.6 assists and 3.6 rebounds last year. Binghamton opens its season at Loyola on Nov. 9.

# 2012-13 Preseason All-Conference

Six returning All-America East selections from last season comprise the 2012-13 America East Preseason All-Conference Team as determined in a vote by the league's head coaches, who were not allowed to vote for their own players. The conference unveiled the six-man squad as part of its America East Basketball Media Luncheon on Tuesday, Oct. 23, which was held at University at Albany's SEFCU Arena, the site of the 2013 America East Men's and Women's Basketball Championship.

Stony Brook's Tommy Brenton, a first-team All-America East standout last season, highlights the team. He is joined by three second-team all-conference honorees in Albany's Mike Black, Boston University's D.J. Irving and UMBC's Chase Plummer. Maine's Alasdair Fraser and Vermont's Brian Voelkel, both third-team recipients last year, round out the squad.

Brenton (Columbia, Md.), a 6-foot-5 senior forward, led Stony Brook to one of its best seasons in program history last year as the Seawolves captured the America East regular-season crown, reached the league title game for the second straight year and made its second NIT appearance in three years. The league's Defensive Player of the Year last season, Brenton helped Stony Brook rank 13th nationally allowing just 59.1 points per contest. He averaged 8.1 rebounds (3rd in AE), 3.4 assists (6th in AE) to go with 7.8 points per game. He earned Co-Player of the Week honors on Jan. 23.

Black (Chicago, Ill.) earned all-conference accolades for the second straight year in 2011-12 after ranking 10th among league leaders in scoring (13.4 ppg) and third in assists (4.3 apg) last year. The 6-foot senior guard, who has twice been named America East Player of the Week in his career, led a Great Dane attack that paced the league in several categories including points per game (72.1 ppg) and field goal percentage (.446). Black is the conference's active leading scorer (1,024 points) and assist man (299 assists).

Irving (Philadelphia, Pa.), one of the conference's top playmakers, led America East with 5.4 assists per game last season en route to earning second-team all-conference honors. An All-Rookie selection as a freshman, he also increased his own scoring output in 2011-12, averaging a career-best 11.4 points per game, which ranked 18th in the league, while shooting 43.1 percent from the field, which ranked second among guards. The 6-foot junior guard twice earned Player of the Week honors last year.

Plummer (Plainfield, N.J.) broke out in 2011-12 to earn second-team all-conference accolades. The 6-foot-6 junior forward averaged 15.4 points and 7.4 rebounds per game last season after contributing just 6.7 points and 3.7 rebounds per game as a freshman. Plummer, the only player to rank in the conference's Top-5 in both scoring (fourth) and rebounding (fifth), was even better in conference play as he went over 20 points five times in 16 games and was third averaging 16.7 points per contest.

Fraser (Falkirk, Scotland) emerged as one of the best low-post presences in the conference last year as he ranked 12th in scoring (12.9 ppg), fourth in rebounding (7.8 rpg), third in blocked shots (1.4 bpg) and third in field goal percentage (.543) en route to earning third-team All-America East honors. The 6-foot-7 forward, who helped Maine rank second in the league in scoring (68.6 ppg), registered an America East-best eight double-doubles last year and twice earned Player of the Week recognition.

Voelkel (Pleasantville, N.Y.) picked up where he left off during his Rookie of the Year campaign in 2010-11 as he led the conference in rebounding (8.6 rpg) for the second-straight year. The 6-foot-6 junior forward, who was an All-Defensive selection, also ranked second in assists (5.1 apg) and finished third in steals (1.7 spg). In addition to his stellar regular season, Voelkel averaged four points, 12 rebounds and seven assists in three America East Championship games to earn Most Outstanding Player honors and lead UVM to its fifth league crown.





# Team Notes



- Albany returns eight letterwinners and three starters from a team that won 19 games last year, its most since the 2006-07 season.
- Senior Mike Black (13.4 ppg, 4.3 apg in 2011-12) will be the catalyst for the Great Danes after earning second-team all-conference honors last year.
- Black is the conference's active leading scorer (1,024 points) and assist man (299 assists).
- Senior Jayson Guerrier will assume a more active role in the team's plans this year after posting a league-best .423 three-point shooting percentage last year (41-for-97).
- The Great Danes relied on their offense in 2011-12, leading the league in scoring (72.1 ppg) and becoming just the third team ever and first since 1989 to pace the conference in field goal, three-point and free throw percentage.
- Albany will need to replace the scoring output of all-conference performers Gerardo Suero (21.5 ppg) and Logan Aronhalt (13.8 ppg), who accounted for 45 percent of its points in 2011-12.
- Will Brown, the longest tenured head coach in America East, begins his 12th season at Albany two wins shy of 150 for his career.
- Albany will host the 2013 America East Championship at its own SEFCU Arena, where it went 10-4 last year.

- Binghamton begins its first season under Tommy Dempsey after going just 2-29 in 2011-12.
- Dempsey comes to Binghamton after spending seven seasons as the head coach at Rider, where he went 119-105, made three postseason appearances (CBI, 2008; CIT, 2009, 2011) and earned 2008 MAAC Coach of the Year honors.
- The Bearcats return nine letterwinners and three starters from last year's team, which won two of its final five games after an 0-26 start, including handing Vermont one of three of its conference losses and winning a conference tournament game for the second-straight year.
- Senior Jimmy Gray will direct the Bearcats after averaging 8.3 points, 3.6 assists and 3.6 rebounds as a junior.
- Gray also led the league in steals (1.9 spg), the fifth time in 11 years a Bearcat has done so.
- Leading scorer Robert Mansell (14.0 ppg), who ranked fifth among league leaders last year, will sit out the upcoming season after undergoing offseason knee surgery for an injury he suffered Feb. 23 against Albany.
- Binghamton led America East in attendance for the ninth straight season in 2011-12, drawing 2,781 fans per game to the Events Center.

- Seven letterwinners, including three starters, are back for a Hartford team that was the youngest in the league last year, as freshmen accounted for 60.4 percent of the team's scoring output.
- After starting last season 0-13, the young Hawks went .500 down the stretch (9-9) and took eventual league champion Vermont to double overtime in the semifinals of the America East Championship before falling, 77-73.
- Mark Nwakamma and Nate Sikma return as sophomores after becoming the first Hartford tandem to each earn America East All-Rookie honors in the same year last season.
- Nwakamma, who ranked second among America East leaders shooting 55.2 percent from the floor last year, was second on his team averaging 9.6 points and 3.9 rebounds per game. He was even better over his final seven games, contributing 13.3 points and 5.4 rebounds per contest.
- Sikma, son of seven-time NBA All-Star Jack Sikma, averaged 8.7 points and team-best 4.3 rebounds per game last year.
- Sophomore Wes Cole's 62 three-pointers were fifth most in the league last year.
- John Gallagher begins his third season as Hartford's head coach and has taken his team to the America East semifinals in each of his first two seasons.
- Hartford led the league in steals for the second straight season last year with 6.6 per game.

# Team Notes



- Maine welcomes back six lettermen and three starters from its 2011-12 squad and is the league's only team to bring back an all-conference, all-rookie and all-defensive selection.
- The Black Bears started last season 8-5, but dropped 12 of their final 17 games.
- Maine ranked second in America East averaging 68.6 points per game last year.
- Junior Alasdair Fraser, a preseason all-conference selection, emerged as a low-post presence last year as he led the league in double-doubles (8), ranked 12th in scoring (12.9 ppg) and fourth in rebounding (7.8 rpg) en route to earning third-team All-America East honors.
- Sophomore Justin Edwards exploded onto the scene and earned All-Rookie recognition by averaging 13.9 points (6th in AE), 5.6 rebounds (12th) and 1.4 steals (T-5th).
- Fraser and Edwards were the league's only teammates to rank in the top-15 in both scoring and rebounding a year ago.
- Senior Mike Allison led the league and ranked 37th nationally in blocks (2.2 bpg) and also pulled down 6.9 boards per game (6th in AE) to garner America East All-Defensive team accolades.
- The Black Bears will have to replace three-time all-conference guard Gerald McLemore, who finished his career 27th on the league's all-time scoring list (1,657 points).
- Eight of Maine's 13 players are from foreign countries.

# Team Notes



- Aki Thomas inherits a squad that brings back more letterwinners (11) and scoring output (82.8 percent) from last year than any other America East squad.
- Thomas, who's been a UMBC assistant for the last five seasons, was named acting head coach on October 10 following Randy Monroe's resignation.
- UMBC will have to improve defensively to turn things around after allowing a league-worst 77.1 points per game last year.
- Junior Chase Plummer, one of four returning UMBC starters, is the league's top returning scorer (15.4 ppg in 2011-12) and fourth-leading rebounder (7.9 rpg).
- Plummer, a second-team All-America East standout, was the lone player to rank in the league's top five in both scoring (4th) and rebounding (5th) last season.
- Senior Ryan Cook made an impact in his first season in Baltimore. The junior college transfer was 13th in the conference with 12.5 points per game.
- Senior Brian Neller, who averaged 11.4 points a year ago, sank 81 three pointers, the second-most in the league and has hit 170 in his career, the most of any active player.
- UMBC will have the services of junior big man Brett Roseboro after he sat out last season. The 6-10 transfer appeared in 44 games for St. Bonaventure during the 2009-10 and 10-11 seasons.

# Team Notes



- New Hampshire will have nine letterwinners and three starters back from its 2011-12 squad, which tied for fifth in the conference standings, the program's best finish since 2009.
- The Wildcats ranked in the 80th percentile nationally in scoring defense last season, holding foes to just 62.8 points per game, which ranked third in America East.
- UNH was the best in the conference defending the three pointer last season as it held opponents to 29.7 percent shooting from deep, which ranked 13th nationally.
- UNH closed last season with wins in five of its final seven games.
- Senior Chandler Rhoads, the team's top returning scorer (11.2 ppg in 2011-12), earned America East All-Defensive honors for the second straight year.
- Senior Patrick Konan was UNH's third-leading scorer last season (9.7 ppg) and second-leading rebounder (5.8 rpg), which ranked 10th in the conference.
- The Wildcats will have to replace the output of two-time All-America East guard Alvin Abreu, who averaged 13.5 points per game last year and finished with 1,564 for his career.
- Bill Herrion begins his eighth year at UNH and 22nd in America East. The former Drexel coach is the league all-time leader in championship wins (21) and ranks second in conference wins (150), just two victories behind former Boston U. coach Dennis Wolff for the most in league history.

# Team Notes



- Stony Brook is coming off its best season in its Division I history and brings back eight letter-winners from a team that won the America East regular-season crown, reached the league title game for the second straight year and made its second NIT appearance in three years last season.
- The Seawolves were among the best rebounding teams in the country last year, ranking fourth with a plus-8.3 rebound margin.
- Stony Brook was one of 19 teams in the nation to allow fewer than 60 points per game last season, ranking 13th surrendering just 59.1 points per contest.
- Senior forward Tommy Brenton, the America East Defensive Player of the Year in 2011-12, is the conference's lone returning first-team all-conference performer. He averaged 8.1 rebounds (3rd in AE), 3.4 assists (6th in AE) to go with 7.8 points per game last year.
- Brenton already ranks 18th on America East's all-time rebounding list with 836 career boards.
- Junior Dave Coley is the team's top returning scorer (10.0 ppg in 2011-12).
- Eighth year head coach Steve Pikiell won his second America East Coach of the Year Award in three seasons last year. Fifty-nine of his 95 wins at Stony Brook have come in the last three years.
- The Seawolves will appear in ESPN's Tip-Off Marathon for the second time in three years on Nov. 13 when it faces Rider on ESPN at 6 a.m.

# Team Notes



- Vermont will have six players, including three starters, back from its 2012 America East champion squad. The league title was the Catamounts' fifth since 2003.
- The Catamounts beat Lamar, 71-59, in the first round of the NCAA tournament for its second-ever NCAA win before falling to top-seeded North Carolina in the second round.
- Vermont went 24-12 last year, its ninth 20-win season in its last 11. UVM had zero 20-win campaigns in its first 87 seasons.
- The Catamounts were among the top defensive teams in the league last year, ranking second and 31st nationally in scoring defense (60.9 ppg) and first in field goal percentage defense (.406).
- Junior Brian Voelkel earned third-team All-America East honors last year after leading the league in rebounding (8.6 rpg), ranking second in assists (5.1 apg) and finishing third in steals (1.7 spg).
- Junior Sandro Carissimo, an All-America East Championship selection last year, emerged as one of the top point guards in the league averaging 7.0 points, 3.0 rebounds and 2.4 assists.
- Junior Luke Apfeld is the team's top returning scorer (10.0 ppg in 2011-12).
- John Becker starts his second season in Burlington after becoming just the second America East coach (Karl Fogel, Northeastern - 1986) to win the league title in his first year on the bench.






