

- Boston University advanced to the NCAA Field Hockey Championship quarterfinals with a 1-0 win over Iowa in the NCAA first round.
- The Terriers had earned the bid to the NCAA Championship by virtue of their third-straight America East Championship.
- Boston University had a program-best 18-6 record and was ranked No. 11 in the final NFHCA poll. Albany was ranked No. 19 after its 15-5 season. The win total was the highest in the Great Danes' Division I history.
- Boston University's Pam Spuehler was one of four finalists for the Honda Broderick Award for field hockey, given to the nation's top player. She was the first Terrier student-athlete selected as a finalist in any sport for the Broderick Award.
- Spuehler was named a first-team All-American by the NFHCA. Boston University's Suus Dekker and Albany's Michelle Simpson were chosen to the second team. Vermont's Danielle Collins and Boston University's Sarah Hudak were selected to the third team.
- Boston University's Sally Starr was named the Dita/NFHCA Northeast Coach of the Year.
- America East teams had wins over five nationally-ranked opponents during the season.
