

WOMEN'S LACROSSE

- Boston University met New Hampshire in the first round of the NCAA Women's Lacrosse Championship as America East placed two teams into the tournament for the first time since 2000.
- Boston University was the No. 7 seed in the NCAA Championship and advanced to the quarterfinals, where the Terriers dropped an 8-5 decision to NCAA runner-up Penn. It marked the second time in America East history that a team had been a national seed in the tournament. The Terriers tied a school record with 18 wins.
- Boston University (No. 7) and New Hampshire (No. 13) were both nationally ranked in the final regular season IWLCA Poll.
- Boston University's Sarah Dalton was one of 18 nominees for the Tewaaraton Trophy, given to the nation's top player across all divisions.
- Dalton was also named to the IWLCA All-American first team. She was joined by teammate Lauren Morton on the second team and New Hampshire's Michaela Hardy on the third team.
- Dalton (first team), Hardy (second), Morton (third) and Vermont's Kristen Millar (third) were named to the womenslacrosse.com All-America team.
