## ATHLETICS SUCCESS

America East teams combined for nine wins in NCAA Championships in 2011-12, the most in conference history, including the Stony Brook baseball team's memorable run to the College World Series. Thirty student-athletes earned All-America honors, including Lucy Van Dalen, who became the third NCAA national champion in conference

Each America East school earned points in the Learfield Sports NACDA Cup, with five among the top 150 of the 370 Division I

America East also enjoys a partnership with College For Every Student (CFES), providing student mentors and campus opportunities to help underserved elementary and middle school students prepare for, gain access to, and succeed in college. Each year America East honors a student-athlete with the CFES Service Award for leadership and dedication to CFES.

America East is committed to transforming the way the conference communicates with fans to promote its teams and student-athletes through the convergence of online video, mobile technologies and social media.

America East has joined forces with ESPN3 and WatchESPN, the most complete live stream destination for college sports, for more productions than ever in 2012-13 giving fans access to live events via multiple platforms across the country. Additionally, all team championships are streamed live via ESPN3 or the conference's website.
